Today's Gospel

In the section of the Gospel just before the verses proclaimed today, Jesus called his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family.

A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. And the scribes think he is possessed by the devil. Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong man, Beelzebub, and overcomes him.

He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this. It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit.

Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood.

Changes to the Data Protection Law

You will be aware of the recent changes to the Data Protection Law. While it will reduce cold calls it also has huge implications on organisations like churches that hold a lot of data about the worshippers like Baptism, Confirmation, First Holy communion, marriage and death records. Churches also hold some financial records due to Gift Aid requirements and standing orders. Most importantly churches have their worshippers address and contact details. We will not be able to use any of that without your explicit permission to contact you in the way you specify.

A new GDPR (General Data Protection Regulations) form will be given out after all Masses today and thereafter will be given to new parishioners when they join us, o comply with the following instruction given to all priests: "It (GDPR form) should be made available to all parishioners by the best possible means. The majority will be those who regularly attend Mass so distribution at the church will reach them. Those parishioners who are either unable to attend Mass or are irregular attendees should have a copy sent to their home address".

Share the Journey

Pope Francis has launched *Share the Journey*, a new global campaign to stand up for the rights of refugees and migrants. The timescale of the campaign is from now until the Pope goes to address the UN in September 2018. A week of action will also take place during Refugee Week in June. In

support of the campaign, CAFOD are aiming to walk 24,901 miles - the distance around the whole world! All parishes and schools are invited to engage in this campaign. It's an act of solidarity to *Share the Journey* with our global neighbours fleeing their homes. Every step you take, together with others from across the England & Wales, will send a message to world leaders that they must step up too. They need to act with courage and compassion when they agree ambitious new UN agreements on refugees and migration in 2018. World Meeting of Families

Dublin, Ireland, has been chosen by Pope Francis to host the next World Meeting of Families, from 21st 26th August 2018, guided by the theme "The Gospel of the Family: Joy for the World". Held every three years, this major international event brings together families from across the world to celebrate, pray and reflect upon the central importance of marriage and the family as the cornerstone of our lives, of society and of the Church. The event has at its heart the following key moments: 21st August 2018, a National Opening of WMOF2018, which will take place simultaneously in all the different dioceses of Ireland. 22nd to 24th August 2018, a three-day Congress. Each day will reflect on the theme "The Gospel of the Family: Joy for the World" chosen by the Holy Father and will include an enriching programme for adults of keynote speakers, workshops, talks, testimonies and discussions; an engaging and exciting programme for young people as well as fun activities for children. Sunday 26th August 2018, WMOF2018 will close with a solemn Eucharistic Celebration that will gather thousands of people from Ireland and all over the world.
