#### Lætare Sunday

Today is the fourth, or middle, Sunday of Lent, called Lætare Sunday from the first words of the Introit at Mass, "Lætare Jerusalem" — "Rejoice, O Jerusalem". Strictly speaking, the Thursday before Lætare Sunday is the middle day of Lent, and it was at one time observed as such, but afterwards the special signs of joy permitted on this day, intended to encourage the faithful in their course through the season of penance, were transferred to the following Sunday.

#### Today's Gospel

Today's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this phrase.

The second part of today's Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus. The Gospel of John is known for this kind of reflection offered within the narrative. In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives.

## **Mothering Sunday**

Mothering Sunday is a holiday celebrated by Catholic and Protestant Christians in some parts of Europe. It falls on the fourth Sunday in Lent, exactly three weeks before Easter. During the 16<sup>th</sup> century, people returned to their mother church for a service to be held on Lætare Sunday; in this context, one's 'mother church' was either the church where you were baptised, the local parish church, or the nearest cathedral. Anyone who did this was commonly said to have gone "a-mothering". Today, the secular celebration of Mother's Day has come to represent a day when children honour the mother of the family, by presenting gifts and cards in recognition of the service and sacrifice made by their mothers in raising their children. Today we pray especially for all mothers.

#### Re-Scheduled Lenten Station Mass

Lenten Station Masses are held in the seven deaneries across the Diocese of East Anglia, celebrated by Bishop Alan Hopes. Each Mass begins with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Sacrament of Reconciliation at 6pm, followed by the Station Mass at 7pm celebrated by Bishop Alan and priests of the deanery. The Mass is followed by soup, bread and cheese afterwards. The Ipswich Station Mass was due to have taken place on Friday March 1<sup>st</sup> but was postponed due to the bad weather. It will now take place Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> March, at St Pancras Church.
