Today's Gospel

Today's Gospel follows immediately after the Gospel proclaimed last week, in which Jesus taught that he was the vine and that his disciples were the branches. In that example, we learned that our union with Jesus will lead to fruitful service. Today's reading extends this teaching to describe the kind of service that Christians are called upon to offer to others.

In John's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm that he is known by the Father and that his disciples will know the Father by knowing Jesus. In this passage, however, Jesus reminds his disciples that this knowledge is to be expressed in love. Those who know Jesus well - and Jesus says that his disciples do know him - will love one another. Knowledge leads to love, which leads to action. Even more, a true disciple shows a particular kind of love, sacrificial love. John reminds his community that Jesus also taught that a disciple is one who had been chosen - chosen by Jesus. To be chosen by Jesus, however, is not to be set apart from the world, rather to be chosen by Jesus is to be serve the world as he did.

The disciples of Jesus were chosen and were sent into the world to bear fruit by serving others, by sacrificing for others, in love. We know that Jesus himself gives us the greatest example of the kind of love and service that he teaches to his disciples. He has, in fact, laid down his life for his friends, for his disciples, and for us. Through his death and Resurrection, we have received the grace to love others as Jesus has commanded.

The Ascension

Thursday next, 10th May, is the feast of the Ascension and a Holyday of Obligation on which Catholics are obliged to attend Mass. Mass will be at 9:30 am and 7:30 pm. Children from St Pancras school will be attending the 9:30 am Mass in church.

In his message for this day, Pope Francis speaks of journalists as *"protectors of news"*. Their task is *"not just a job, but a mission"*. To support the church's work in this important field, the Communications Office of the Bishop's Conference of England and Wales is a team working in the media to publicise and promote Catholic content within mainstream media. Recently it played a key role in securing a special investigation by the Evening Standard and the Independent into the scourge of modern slavery and works behind the scenes with broadcasters and print journalists to articulate Catholic views on news stories. To help support its work, there will be a retiring collection next Sunday, 13th May, after all Masses.
