'When I came here I didn't have that much faith in God, but these two days have given me faith and hope'. (One of the young people at the Ignite Festival)




Donate

- Accomodation, food and allowances are provided


Not able to join the team full time but would like to be involved? Jopin Ignite Lite, our volunteer team open to all those aged 16 - 35
