Mass options during Easter Season

There are several different options that we can use throughout Mass throughout the liturgical year. However, it is nice to have some that we use at specific times. Having not been in a parish on my own, I thought it would be nice for us to try some. So, during the Easter season (up until Pentecost) we will be singing/saying the Kyrie and Christi eleison as our penitential act, we will sing the Alleluia at the Gospel Acclamation and we will be using the Apostle's Creed rather than the Nicene Creed.

I would also like us, on a Sunday, to sing the Mass parts; the Holy, Holy, Holy and the Lamb of God. We will use the plain chant tunes that appear in most Mass books.

I will lead us through this before each Mass on Sunday; sorry if it's a bit high!
