Whilst we continue to celebrate Easter, I would like to offer a couple of hours reflection for both of these ministries as we begin to open up further after Covid; and especially with the Bishops Conference announcing the reinstating of the Sunday Obligation from Pentecost Sunday.

I am offering two sessions, which ministers may attend either session. I would like all ministers to attend. These would begin with the 11am Mass, with a short input from myself, and opportunity to ask questions, to spend some time in quiet prayer and then to look at an opportunity of recommissioning of both ministries during Sunday Masses as soon as possible. Each session will be from 11am until 1pm.

It is important that we come together to look afresh at how we offer these ministries to the whole community.

On Thursday, the Solemnity of the Ascension, the disciples, after watching Jesus ascend into heaven, are asked by two angels why they are standing looking into the sky when there is work to be done!

We too are called to the same work the disciples were; to spread the Good News of Jesus, to be involved in our local communities doing good and to be involved in our own parish, helping out where ever possible.

As we begin to live lives more normally and as the Church calls us all back to practicing our faith each Sunday in person, it is a perfect time to take stock, to reflect and to think about how we can all get involved in all of these areas, but perhaps especially within the Parish. Could you help clean, could you help set up for Mass or tidy away afterwards, could you help welcome people, would you like to be an Altar Server, a Reader, an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist? If you answer yes to any of these, please do speak to me after Mass... for our parish relies on the help of its own parishioners to grow and flourish.

Diocese of East Anglia - Pilgrimage to Walsingham

This years pilgrimage to Walsingham is due to take place on Tuesday 31st May. It will begin at noon at the Catholic National Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham, with a Mass held in and outside the Chapel of Our Lady of Reconciliation.

After the Mass there will be time for a picnic, before pilgrims will walk along the Holy Mile to the village of Little Walsingham. Bishop Alan will lead Benediction at the original site of the Holy House which contained the image of Our Lady before it was

destroyed at the time of the Reformation.

All members of the diocese are invited to join, with parish groups encouraged to bring banners representing their Parish. The Pilgrimage it expected to finish around 4.30pm
