Finances

Would all those parishioners who normally make their weekly offering using Giftaid envelopes please note that their new 2022/23 envelopes are now available for collection from the Narthex.

I would encourage those of you who, during the pandemic have converted to paying by standing order/direct credit into our bank account to continue this practice as it greatly assists the church finances. If you can't find your envelopes in the box please see either Fr. Paul, Chris Croker (Giftaid co-ordinator) or another member of the Finance Committee. f anyone who has already signed up to giving by Giftaid has changed their address during the last year or did not pay sufficient income or capital gains tax to cover the tax reclaimable on their offerings then please notify one of the above. Finally, the tax reclaimable from HMRC is an important source of funds for our parish and currently makes up 10% of our annual income. I would therefore strongly recommend that those of you who pay tax but have not made a Giftaid declaration do so as soon as possible. There is no ongoing commitment and it will **boost the value of your offering to the parish by 25% at no cost to yourself**.

Forms are available in the Narthex and when completed should be handed to either Fr. Paul or Chris Croker. Thank you for your continuing support."
