Today's Gospel: Today's Gospel continues to elaborate on the tension between Jesus and the scribes and Pharisees. Having concluded a series of dialogues with the Pharisees and other religious leaders, Jesus now directs his words to the crowds, warning them not to follow the example of the scribes and Pharisees. The scribes and Pharisees were teachers of the Mosaic Law. They were entrusted with its interpretation and, thus, were influential in determining Jewish practice. To appreciate the conflict that is evident in this passage, we must understand that Jesus was basing his teachings on the same laws and traditions available to the Pharisees. Both were interpreting the Law of Moses to better adapt it to contemporary Jewish life. The differences between their teachings, therefore, are often highlighted and amplified by Matthew. This part of Matthew's Gospel reflects aspects of the conflict between his Christian community and Pharisaic Judaism. Matthew's Church is thought to have included many Jewish Christians who may not have believed that a break with the synagogue was necessary to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus tells the crowd that it is correct to do and observe what the scribes and Pharisees teach; it is their example that is to be avoided, namely, their love of being honoured and exalted. Hence, the Gospel reflects the tension of an active internal debate within the early Church... The warning Jesus gives against seeking places of honour in the community was directed as much toward the Christian community as the named Jewish leaders. Indeed, it is a warning that resonates with us today. The Alpha Course: Alpha is an 11 week course providing an opportunity to explore the Christian faith, in a friendly, open and informal environment. Alpha is proven to awaken faith in lapsed Catholics, gives faithful Catholics a path and a language to fulfil their baptismal call to evangelise and is a proven method of introducing people to a living relationship with Jesus Christ. **This year, attending the Alpha course is compulsory for parents of the 2024 Holy Communion children and for those preparing to be received into the Church at Easter, but it is open to all parishioners.** The 90 minute weekly sessions start 15th November and will be held on Wednesdays at 12:30



at St Mary Magdalens and include a light lunch and at St Marks they will start at 7:30 pm and include a cooked meal. Registration forms are available at the back of church and on the parish web site - the QR code takes you straight to the form. **Closing date for registration is 8th November.**

Book of Remembrance: In the Catholic Church the month of November begins with the Solemnity of All Saints' on November 1st, followed by the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed – All Souls' Day' on the 2nd November. Together these days mark the start of a month of remembrance, often referred to as the month of the dead, during which we remember and pray especially for our loved ones who have gone before us and whose loss we feel. On the table at the back of the church there is a Book of Remembrance and you are all invited to write in this the names of those family members and friends who have died, who will then be remembered especially during Masses throughout the month.
