Today's Gospel: Today's Gospel reading is taken from John's Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus' reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night. Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this phrase. Nicodemus misunderstood Jesus at every point, but there was no animosity in the questions he posed to Jesus. In the part of the conversation with Nicodemus in today's Gospel, Jesus referred to an incident reported in the Old Testament. When the Israelites grumbled against the Lord during their solution in the desert. God sent venomous serpents to punish them for their complaints. The Israelites repented and asked Moses to pray for them. The Lord heard Moses' prayer and instructed him to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. All who had been bitten by a serpent and then looked upon the bronze serpent were cured. By recalling this story, Jesus alludes to the salvation that would be accomplished through his death and Resurrection. The second part of today's Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus. The Gospel of John is known for this kind of reflection offered within the narrative. The words of the Evangelist are in continuity with the words of the prologue to John's Gospel. In these reflections, John elaborates on a number of themes that are found in his Gospel: light and darkness, belief and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation. In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so

that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives. *Courtesy Loyola Press*

Lætare Sunday: Today is the fourth, or middle, Sunday of Lent, called *Lætare* Sunday from the first words of the Introit at Mass, "Lætare Jerusalem" - "Rejoice, O Jerusalem". Strictly speaking, the Thursday before *Lætare* Sunday is the middle day of Lent, and it was at one time observed as such, but afterwards the special signs of joy permitted on this day, intended to encourage the faithful in their course through the season of penance, were transferred to the following Sunday. On this Sunday the priest wears rose coloured vestments instead of the normal purple worn at other times during Lent.

Mothering Sunday: Mothering Sunday is a holiday celebrated by Catholic and Protestant Christians in some parts of Europe. It falls on the fourth Sunday in Lent, exactly three weeks before Easter. During the 16th century, people returned to their mother church for a service to be held on *Lætare* Sunday; in this context, one's 'mother church' was either the church where you were baptised, the local parish church, or the nearest cathedral. Anyone who did this was commonly said to have gone "a-mothering". Today, the secular celebration of Mother's Day has come to represent a day when children honour the mother of the family, by presenting gifts and cards in recognition of the service and sacrifice made by their mothers in raising their children. Today we pray especially for all mothers.

If anyone who has already signed up to giving by Gift Aid has changed their address during the last year, or did not pay sufficient income or capital gains tax to cover the tax reclaimable on their offerings, then please notify either Fr. Luke, Fr. Paul or Chris Croker (Gift Aid Co-ordinator).

Sheila Curry RIP: Sheila Curry, one of the last few remaining parish founding family members, passed away Saturday 10th February in the Ipswich Hospital, having only recently celebrated her 97th birthday. Please remember Sheila in your prayers, and pray also for the comfort of her family and friends who mourn her passing. There will be a Requiem Mass for Sheila on Tuesday at 10:30 am.

Chrism Mass: The Chrism Mass, one of the main Diocesan events of the year, will be celebrated by Bishop Peter in the Cathedral of St John, Norwich on Tuesday 26th March at 11:30. At this Mass the oils for the Sacraments are blessed, and priests, deacons and people of the Diocese renew their commitment to serve. A coach will be travelling from St Mary's church, Woodbridge Road, departing at 9:00 am and this is open to members of all Ipswich parishes. There will be a fare of £15 return for the coach and if you would like to sign up, please contact the parish secretary at St Mary's by email using secretary@st-mary.org.uk

Why Should I Be Chosen? The political context of Jesus life and ministry is evident in this production as Jesus lived and ministered during a time of imperial occupation and *The Chosen* conveys the political significance of Israel's subjugation to the mighty Roman Empire. You also see the power-play between the Pharisees and a religious establishment determined to stamp out challenges to their authority. *The Chosen* helps you understand the controversy created by Jesus' actions and his claims. In displaying his humanity, it does not downplay Jesus' supernatural power and his claims to be the Messiah. But this is deeply controversial because Jesus of Nazareth was not the Messiah anyone was expecting - to many he was a deluded and dangerous blasphemer who should be condemned and silenced. *The Chosen* is coming to St Mary Magdalen church soon!

First Holy Communion 2024: The instruction classes for this year's First Holy Communion candidates continues, with the next class, the fifth in the programme, on Friday 15th March at St Mark's church, Hawthorne Drive, starting at 6:00 pm, and Saturday 16th March when the class will be held at St Mary Magdalen church starting at 9:30 am.
