**Today's Gospel:** In today's Gospel, an unnamed man approaches Jesus and enquires about what he must do to inherit eternal life. Jesus replies that one must follow the commandments of the Law of Moses. The man acknowledges that he has observed all of these since his childhood. Jesus then says that only one thing is lacking: he must give his possessions to the poor and follow Jesus, but hearing this, the man leaves in sadness, and Mark tells us that this is because he had many possessions. Jesus made two requirements of the wealthy man who approached him – firstly to give up his possessions. Throughout history, some Christians have taken this literally. Their example witnesses to us a radical commitment to the Gospel of Jesus. Some have read this as a particular requirement directed to this specific individual. Still others have sought to explain the meaning intended by the word *possession* as those things that prevent one from following Jesus. Christians have generally understood that at the least, following Jesus requires that believers hold material possessions loosely and remain vigilant against seeking security in accumulating possessions. The second requirement Jesus made of this man was the invitation that Jesus extends to all would-be disciples: "follow *me*." Jesus very much wanted this man to be his disciple. We believe that the Christian faith is one in which each believer is in a personal relationship with Jesus. Just as this Gospel tells us that Jesus loves the man and is sad when he departs, so too, Jesus loves us and is saddened when we are unable to follow him. To his disciples, Jesus laments the

challenges faced by those who are rich in following him and entering the Kingdom of God. In reply to the disciples' astonishment at the strictness of the standard that Jesus speaks about today, Jesus reminds his disciples that nothing is impossible with God. Salvation is determined by our ability to rely completely upon God. Peter replies to Jesus by boasting that the disciples have already given up everything. Jesus acknowledges that those who have given up everything for the sake of the Gospel will be rewarded. This reward begins now, in the new community that one will gain in this life, and will continue in the eternal age to come. Next Weekend: Next Sunday, 20th October, is World Mission Sunday, our chance to show love and solidarity to our brothers and sisters overseas who share our faith. In offering our prayers, we join with missionaries everywhere in communion and compassion to support them in spreading the Good News, and by giving a donation we respond to Christ's call to feed the hungry and clothe the naked. Missio is responsible for coordinating World Mission Sunday and provides new, young or poor dioceses with the essential support they need on their journey to becoming self-sufficient. To support the work of Missio, next weekend there will be a second collection taken at all three Masses.

First Holy Communion 2025: The registration of children wishing to make their First Holy Communion next year is now open. Parents of candidates will be required to attend an Alpha course, or to have recently already done so.

Alpha Course: The new Alpha course will be starting on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> October – a lunch time session will be held at St Mary Magdalen church and an evening session at St Mark's church. This course is recommended for everyone. Each session starts with a meal together - a light lunch of soup for the St Mary Magdalen's session and a meal at the St Mark's session. This shared meal is followed by a video after which you break into small groups to discuss and share views about what you have seen. There is no charge for the course, and those that have previously attended can attest to the valuable contribution it has made to obtaining a deeper understanding of their faith. There is a short

introductory video available on the parish web site – why not take a look? The QR code will take you directly to it. There is a sign-up sheet in the church porch and you are all warmly encouraged to sign up for this and encourage friends and family to come along too - Catholic or not, believer or not.

On Saturdays 2<sup>nd</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> November there will be two episodes shown each evening with a short break in the middle. Refreshments will be provided. Last time, the whole experience was greatly enjoyed by those that attended, but the overall level of attendance was disappointing given the size of the parish. Hopefully a lot more will come along for season 2 and enjoy this very worthwhile series.
