

Today's Gospel: Today's reading is the turning point in Mark's Gospel. In the presentation of the life and ministry of Jesus found in the Gospel of Mark, the deeds of Jesus have shown Jesus to be the Son of God. Yet many, including Jesus' disciples, have not yet realised his identity. In today's Gospel, Jesus asks the disciples for a field report by asking what others say about him. He then turns the question directly to the disciples and asks what they believe. Peter speaks for all of them when he announces that they believe Jesus to be the Christ. The word Christ is the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for Messiah, which means "the anointed one." At the time of Jesus, the image of the Messiah was laden with popular expectations, most of which looked for a political leader who would free the Jewish people from Roman occupation. Jesus does not appear to have used this term for himself. As we see in today's reading, Jesus refers to himself instead as the Son of Man, a term derived from the Jewish Scriptures, found in the Book of Daniel and in other apocryphal writings. Many scholars suggest that the phrase Son of Man is best understood to mean "human being." Now that the disciples have acknowledged Jesus as the Christ, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his ministry: he will be rejected, must suffer and die, and will rise after three days. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely. The image of Christ that Jesus is giving is not the image of the Messiah that Peter was expecting. Jesus then teaches the crowd and the disciples about the path of discipleship: to be Christ's disciple is to follow in the way of the cross. We can easily miss the fear that Jesus' words must have evoked in his disciples. Death by crucifixion was all too familiar as a method of execution in Roman-occupied territories. It was also an omnipresent danger to the Christian community for whom Mark wrote. The path that Jesus was inviting his disciples to share meant tremendous suffering and death. Evangelii Gaudium Sunday: Today is *Evangelii Gaudium* Sunday, formerly known as Home Mission Sunday, when the church focuses on the call of Our Lord to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations". We are all called to be missionaries of Christ and to spread the Good News to all through our words, actions, example and behaviour. To help the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales in their missionary work, there will be a retiring collection taken at all Masses this weekend – collectors please note.

Communion Under Both Kinds: From Advent, it is hoped to reintroduce Communion Under Both Kinds at Mass. This will inevitably mean we will need more Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass. Fr Luke is currently looking for candidates to take on this special Ministry within the parish. If you are approached, please prayerfully consider what is being asked of you and be prepared to offer yourself to serve in this capacity.

150 Club: The next prize draw of the parish 150 Club, the September draw which will include the 6 month Bonus Prizes, will be held in the Garden Room after the 10:00 Mass on Sunday 29th September. There are still many unallocated numbers in the Club and thus plenty of room for new subscribers, and time before the September draw for new members to join. Several people have recently taken membership forms and indicated they would join the 150 Club, or extend their membership, but have not thus far returned those forms. If you are one of these, it would be greatly appreciated if you could return the completed form straight away. Please do consider signing up for the next course, or if you would like to help organise and run the next course, please let Fr Paul or Fr Luke know.
