

Good Friday collection is for the Holy Land.

Easter Triduum: Maundy Thursday at 7:30pm begins the Easter Triduum, which is essentially one celebration observed over three days. Following the Mass on Thursday silent prayer will continue for those who want it, up until midnight when we will celebrate Night Prayer. On Good Friday at 3pm we solemnly celebrate the Lord's passion and venerate the cross. (There will also be a 10 am service based on the 7 last words of Christ from the cross at Holy Family) Then we gather on Holy Saturday evening at 8pm for our Easter Vigil, where we, light candles, celebrate the First Mass of Easter, and welcome six new people into the Church. In order to experience the fullness of the Easter celebration, you are strongly encouraged to come to all three days of liturgical celebration if at all possible.

Easter offering: Following the custom of the diocese the Easter offering goes to the priest. This, along with the Christmas offering forms the substantial part of his annual income. If you would like to make an offering, either put money in collection baskets, or make a gift online and reference "Fr Luke". Alternatively, you cand hand cash directly to him.

The Easter Triduum: This three-day period is referred to as the *Easter Triduum*, from the Latin *tris* ("three") and *dies* ("days"). The sacred *Triduum* is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth and the events of his Passion and Resurrection. **Mass of the Lord's Supper:** On Holy Thursday, Jesus gave an example of how we should serve one another by washing the feet of his disciples. This act of service is commemorated at the Mass of the Lord's Supper when the priest washes the feet of 12 persons of the congregation. We are looking for 12 volunteers, young or old, male or female, to take part in this ceremony – a list for names is in the narthex. Please put your name

down if you would like to take part. **Good Friday:** The Solemn Liturgy will be celebrated at 3:00 pm, and there will be Stations of the Cross at 6:00 pm. At the end of the solemn liturgy, there will be a retiring collection for the Shrines of the Holy Land. **Holy Saturday:** The Easter Vigil, comprising four elements - The Service of Light, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of Baptism and the first Mass of Easter - begins after sundown on the day before Easter. Our service will begin at 8:00 pm.

Gift Aid: Would all those parishioners who normally make their weekly offering using Gift Aid envelopes please note that their new 2024`25 envelopes are now available for collection from the Narthex. If you can't find your envelopes in the box, please write your name on the sheet provided for this purpose and they will be made available to you next week. If anyone has changed their details then please notify either Fr. Luke, Fr. Paul or Chris Croker (Gift Aid Coordinator).

Chrism Mass: The Chrism Mass, one of the main Diocesan events of the year, will be celebrated by Bishop Peter in the Cathedral of St John, Norwich on Tuesday 26th March at 11:30 am. A coach will be travelling from St Mary's church, Woodbridge Road, departing at 9:00 am and this is open to members of all Ipswich parishes. There will be a fare of £15 return for the coach and if you would like to sign up, please contact the parish secretary at St Mary's by email using secretary@st-mary.org.uk

Easter Preparation: There will be a special cleaning session to prepare the church for Easter. This will be after the Solemn Liturgy on Good Friday. Flower arranging ready for Easter will take place on Saturday 30th March starting at 8:30 am. Everyone is welcome to come along and help. Offers of greenery to decorate the church will be helpful and gratefully received. Any such donations can be left under the table in the church porch from Wednesday 27th March.

Easter Offering: A reminder that the collection taken at the three Easter Masses next weekend will form the traditional personal gift from the parish to our priest Fr Paul. Please be generous.

When Will I Be Chosen? We are going to be showing *The Chosen* in the parish hall twice monthly on Saturday evenings at 7:30 pm, starting in June. There will be two episodes shown in each session, with a refreshment break between the two. Each session will finish at 9:00 pm.

First Holy Communion 2024: The instruction classes for this year's First Holy Communion candidates takes a break for the Easter holidays – the next session is 19th April at St Mark's church, Hawthorne Drive, starting at 6:00 pm, and 20th April at St Mary Magdalen at 9:30 am. The dates for the remaining classes can be found on the parish web site.

Parish 150 Club: The final draw of the 150 Club year will take place Easter Sunday after the 10:00 am Mass. This draw will include the end of year bonus prizes – the major prizes of the year.
