

All Saints Day: Friday of this week, November 1st, is the Solemnity of All Saints and a Holy Day of Obligation on which all Catholics are required to attend Mass. There will be two Masses celebrated on Friday – at 10:00 am and at 6:00 pm. Saturday 2nd November is the Commemoration of all the Faithfull Departed, known more commonly as All Souls Day. Although not a Holy Day of Obligation, it is a day of special prayer and contemplation for all those Holy Souls who have already passed from this life, and there will be Mass celebrated at 10:00 am on Saturday morning for all the Holy Souls in addition to the Vigil Mass for the Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time which will be celebrated at 6:00 pm. The Saturday morning Mass does not fulfil the Sunday Obligation. Once again this year, there will be a memorial book on the table at the back of the church in which you can record the names of your departed loved ones who will be prayed for especially during Masses throughout November – the month of the Holy Souls.

Light Party: Attention all Primary School Children! You're invited to a Light Party, a joyful Christian alternative to Halloween, celebrating the Feast of All Saints. This special event honours the lives of saints who have gone before us, reminding us of the light of Christ in the world. The Light Party will be held in St Mark's church hall on Sunday 3rd November from 4 to 6 pm. There will be pumpkin carving, games, prizes, sweets and treats and family fun, in which the adults are actively encouraged to participate. There is no charge for this event, but you are required to register if you will be attending so that numbers can be gauged. Scan the QR code or got to //stmarksparish.org.uk/light-party to register.

First Holy Communion 2025: The registration of children wishing to make their First Holy Communion next year is now open. Registration is online – go to stmarksparish.org.uk/first-holy-communion, scan the QR code or follow the link from the parish web site. Parents of candidates will be required to attend an Alpha course, or to have recently already done so.

Garden Gate: The gate to the right hand side of the church giving access to the memorial garden is padlocked and normally closed, thus preventing people from visiting without making prior arrangements with a key holder to give them access. To address this, the gate padlock has been changed for a combination lock. If you wish to visit the garden, please email contact@marymagdalens.org and the combination will be sent to you. Your name and email address will also be added to a list and you will be automatically advised if, at any future time, the combination is changed.

Alpha Course: The Alpha takes a break this week for half term holidays, and will continue with session 2 on Wednesday 6th November at 12:30 pm in the Garden Room at St Mary Magdalen church and repeated at 7:30 pm in St Mark's church hall.

Thank You: We are very grateful to the North West Ipswich Big Local Trust which has recently made two grant awards to the parish to be used for improvements to our church hall. These are an award of £1,000 for participating in a Dragons Den event at the end of September and a further £3,000 towards refurbishing the kitchen. We are very grateful to the Trust for these awards which will greatly assist with our continuing activity to modernise our hall.

New Lectionary: As previously announced, the new Lectionary, the book that contains the Scripture readings for Mass and the Sacraments, is changing as part of the continuing process of revising liturgical translations. The revised version comes into effect on the first Sunday of Advent this year, the Church's liturgical new year. A new 4-volume set of books has been purchased for the church. These beautifully produced volumes cost £175 each and each comes with dedication inserts. If you would like to purchase one for the parish, or contribute towards the cost on behalf of your family or perhaps in memory of a loved one, please speak to Fr Luke.

The Chosen: Following the showing of season 1 of the Chosen in the church hall in June, we will be carrying on with Season 2 in November. On Saturdays 9th, 16^{th,} 23rd and 30th November there will be two episodes shown each evening with a short break in the middle. Refreshments will be provided. Last time, the whole experience was greatly enjoyed by those that attended, but the overall level of attendance was disappointing given the size of the parish. Hopefully a lot more will come along for season 2 and enjoy this very worthwhile series.
