

Today's Gospel: Today we continue to read from the Gospel of Mark. Recall that last week we heard Jesus chastise his disciples for their argument about who among them was the greatest. Jesus taught them that the greatest among them will be those who serve the least ones. In today's Gospel, the disciple John questions Jesus about an unknown exorcist who was driving out demons in Jesus' name. John's question might have been motivated by jealousy. Previously in Mark's Gospel, Jesus healed a boy whom the disciples had been unable to heal. John's question is further evidence that the disciples have not yet grasped Jesus' words to them. They continue to compare themselves to others who seem to have greater healing powers, and they do not want to share the power of Jesus' name with others. Exorcism was a common practice in first-century Palestine. Some people had the power to heal the symptoms of possession. One of the strategies used was to invoke the name of a person or figure who was believed to have the power to heal. The disciples observed that the unknown exorcist invoked Jesus' name and was successful in his healing efforts. This unknown healer recognised the power of Jesus' name, yet he was not a follower of Jesus. In his reply to his disciples, Jesus acknowledges that deeds of faith can precede the words of faith. He also teaches that the disciples should not be reluctant to share Jesus' healing powers with others. Later in this Gospel, Jesus teaches us not to create obstacles for those who are just beginning to have faith but to encourage even the smallest signs of faith. The Greek

word used here for sin also connotes "stumbling" or "causing scandal." In vivid terms Jesus teaches his disciples the consequences to those who would put obstacles before people who are on the road to faith. Courtesy Loyola Press

Give to the CAFOD appeal and you'll fund training, tools, equipment and safe spaces so more people like Daniel can learn new skills and fulfil their God-given potential. CAFOD has a special donation page on its web site that you can use for credit and debit card donations and you can find this by scanning the QR code or by following the link on the parish web site. Please note there will be a second collection taken at each Mass next weekend in support of CAFOD's Harvest appeal. If you can't give on-line, please take a special donation envelope from the back of church and remember to bring it back next weekend with your donation inside. If you are able to Gift Aid your donation, please do so as this will enable CAFOD to reclaim from the Government the tax that you have already paid on your donation, thus increasing its value by 25%.

Catholic East Anglia: The October edition of Catholic East Anglia, the Diocesan newspaper, is now available and you can collect a copy free of charge from the back of the church. This edition includes a report on East Anglian delegates at the national *Adoremus* gathering and a report on the annual diocesan pilgrimage to Lourdes. 
