Good Shepherd Sunday: This Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday; a day when we reflect on how the ministry of Christ as Priest, Prophet and Shepherd continues in the Church through the ordained priesthood. Priests do not fall from Heaven ready-made. The call to priesthood needs to be heard, vocations need to be nurtured, and funding is needed to provide for priestly formation. The cost of training a priest is more than £150,000. We all have our part to play in praying and encouraging vocations and in financially supporting for the formation of our future parish priests. Please continue to pray for priestly vocations and be as generous as possible towards the Second Collection on Good Shepherd's Sunday

and channels this is increasingly difficult to achieve. The old days of announcing things in the parish newsletter is very slow, restrictive and outdated and web sites and social media tend to rely on people looking for information rather than having it automatically delivered to them. this proactivity in communicating, as well as providing a central repository for things like duty rotas, events, calendars etc. One key aspect of Churchsuite is to compile and hold contact information for parishioners in a fully GDPR compliant database. This then allows the parish priest and authorised persons within the parish to be able to contact people as required for the purposes of parish administration whilst ensuring that the personal information provided by parishioners remains confidential. The records kept in Churchsuite supersede the information previously held in various paper-based parish records, and in order to ensure the efficiency of these records, it is important that all parishioners register their details to ensure they can be contacted as and when required. If you have not registered for Churchsuite, or you are new to the parish community, please do sign up and register your contact information. You can do so on-line on the parish web site – just scan the QR code to do directly there.
